



**Agriculture Education Spaces:** Venue for schools, Scouts, and day camps to interpret agricultural gardens: Lessons will include: Pioneer Life, Edible Plants, the Role of Farm Animals in the landscape, Cider Making, and many more topics.

**Pioneer Kitchen Garden:** Designed with Proper Gardens, 13 Grounds, and PBG Staff; planting is a "Three Sisters Garden" with vegetables, herbs, and perennials; includes an arched entry gate, low stone wall, and tall perimeter fence; low signage about historic uses of kitchen plants is interior to the garden.

**Heritage Apple Orchard: & Sheep Pasture:** Contains 21 apple trees of multiple varieties, the main "Apple Festival Walk" crushed gravel path with arched arbors on both entries; tree guards and deer fencing, and interpretive panel signage; Sheep pasture includes historic style perimeter fence, gates for movement within pasture, sheep shed with cover for food storage, and access paths.

**Historic Log Cabin:** Historic 1785 log cabin restored for interpretive and demonstration use; includes a water trough, outhouse structure with a composting toilet, and minimal perennial gardens adjacent to the house.

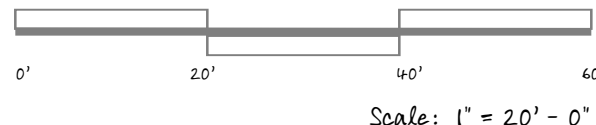
**Chicken Coop & Pen:** Man height coop for demonstration of historic farming practices; covered pen for predator protection; gravel walk access for maintenance.

**Gathering Circle & Fire-pit:** Ring of stones for group gathering purposes and demonstrations or festivities; includes N/S and E/W marker stones; grapevine arbor leads to ravine overlook deck.; great stone at fire-pit area provides area for evening use.

**Birds & Bats:** Bat-house and decorative bird houses provide homes for the local residents.
